

## Seven More ~~Seas~~ Cs

The goal of this activity is to discover and play around with different positions, voicing and inversions of our basic, first position, C major Chord.

A major chord contains a triad of the 1st( the root), the 3rd and the 5th note of the given chord's root note, key scale. For example, The key of C has no sharps or flats so it is easy to find the notes that make up the Cmaj chord triad.



The Cmaj (usually just called C) has only **C E G** notes. Because our Ukulele has 4 strings, we need to play one of these notes twice. With the basic C, (diagram 0) we play the C twice! This is a nice easy 1 finger chord. However any combination of **C E G** anywhere on the neck will produce a C maj chord with a different voicing. Below, I have given just 7 of the 32 different ways to play a Cmaj on the Ukulele.
